New Residents (long time residents too) in Dorsey's Search

I had the pleasure of bumping into a resident one morning. We had a brief conversation and I learned that the person is renting a condo in the village. I did not have an opportunity to mention that we host events specifically for Dorsey's Search residents whether you rent or own. To attend a village sponsored event, proof of residency in the Village is required. If you haven't received your updated government issued ID which displays your new address in our Village, bring in a utility bill with your printed Dorsey's Search address. We love to see as many new faces as we can.

These past few years, the Village has had an uptick in property sales. We are happy to hear that many families want to live in Dorsey's Search. It's a great place to live and raise a family. It is conveniently located at the crossroads of rt. 29 and rt. 108 and only a few minutes away from the Mall, Centennial Park, and Old Ellicott City.

Dorsey's Search is one of the Villages of Columbia. What does that mean? It means that you live on CA assessed property and you pay a Columbia Association (CA) annual charge. An annual charge is a fee for living on CA assessed property which does not give you membership to CA facilities. CA owns many facilities with classes and activities for our residents to enjoy. Residents receive a lower rate for membership. To learn more about facility membership contact CA's membership services department for rates. Their main phone number is 410-715-3000.

CA also takes care of Open Space. Open Space are areas such as playgrounds, basketball courts, pathways, and open fields. An example of Open Space is the area behind the Dorsey Hall pool. CA's Open Space crew will mow, pick up trash, and maintain the playground/basketball court. Any problems with trash along pathways or at playgrounds (aka—tot lots), please contact CA Open Space. Please keep in mind, that the County also has "Open Space" within our Village. Are you confused? No need to worry. The staff at the Village office will help you out.

If you are planning on making any exterior updates (large or small), please contact the Covenant Advisor—Anne McKissick. Her email is located on page 2 or give her a call. Her usual office hours are Tuesday—Thursday from 8am—3pm. We appreciate any question you may have about the guidelines. Property owners are responsible to remove any unapproved alteration if it has been denied. Better to know before you build or install.

Whether you are a new resident or a long time resident, you will hear some local terms which might be thrown around in conversation:

- Playgrounds—tot lots;
- Out-parcel—non-CA assessed property within a Village;
- Pioneer—original homeowner in a Columbia Village;
- Interfaith Center—place of worship for various religions
(Oakland Mills, Owen Brown, Wilde Lake)
- Covenants—rules governing your property

We'd like to welcome all of our new families, but we want to say good-bye to our long time or short term residents. You are what makes the Village a community. It's great to see new faces, but it's sad to see our long time residents leave. Thanks for making our Village your home. Please feel free to share the newsletter with new families on your street. 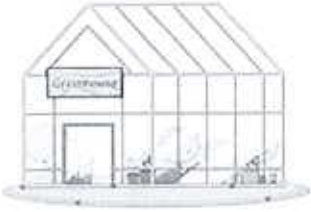

The Howard County Bureau of Highways is responsible for pavement, sidewalks, storm drains, trees, and over 970 miles of county roads for the convenience and safety of the public. Traffic Engineering Division...This division is responsible for traffic signals, streetlight installation, street signs, and traffic calming and safety. 410-313-2430.

Bulk Trash Items: Residents receiving County-provided curbside trash collection are eligible for curbside bulk trash and metal collection. Residents in private areas that do not receive County collection are not eligible for bulk pickup. Remember: Bulk trash items collected by the County will be sent to a landfill. Residents may call 410-313-6444. Large trash items (individual items which do not fit in trash cans) such as mattresses, box springs, chairs, sofas, dressers and tables will be collected. Place these items at the curb on your regular trash day. Maximum of 4 large trash items will be collected per pick-up. Items must be able to be lifted by two collection crew members (larger items will be tagged and left for the resident's disposal). Bulk metal items include metal swing sets, file cabinets, appliances, lawn mowers, exercise equipment, etc. must be scheduled. Please remove doors from refrigerators, and drain oil and gas from lawn mowers. Please go to:

Yard Trim Collection: Howard County offers yard trim collection on the same day as recycling collection. Do not use plastic bags for your yard trim—it will not be collected. Use paper bags or reusable containers without lids only. Howard County offers the "Feed the Green Bin" program in our Village. In a world where native pollinators are in decline, there is much talk and discussion on the right plants to add to your garden. Many of the native varieties suggested now are new to some gardeners and some feel a bit overwhelmed with information on the difference between native vs cultivar varieties. However, there is one group of plants, where you will find familiar options that you can enjoy year after year, require minimal care and fill your garden with scents and attractive blooms that are easy to incorporate, helpful in the kitchen and enhance our palettes as well.

Here is a list of herbs that are beneficial pollinators. They can be added to your garden patch or planted in pots that will add interest to a patio or walk way. Add them and you will see the benefit in the pollinators they attract. There is nothing like sitting on your patio, sipping a favorite drink, pursuing a good book and looking up to see a beautiful butterfly landing on the blossom of a plant. Gardening can bring such simple pleasures and, in some cases, a sense of accomplishment in doing something to help our environment.

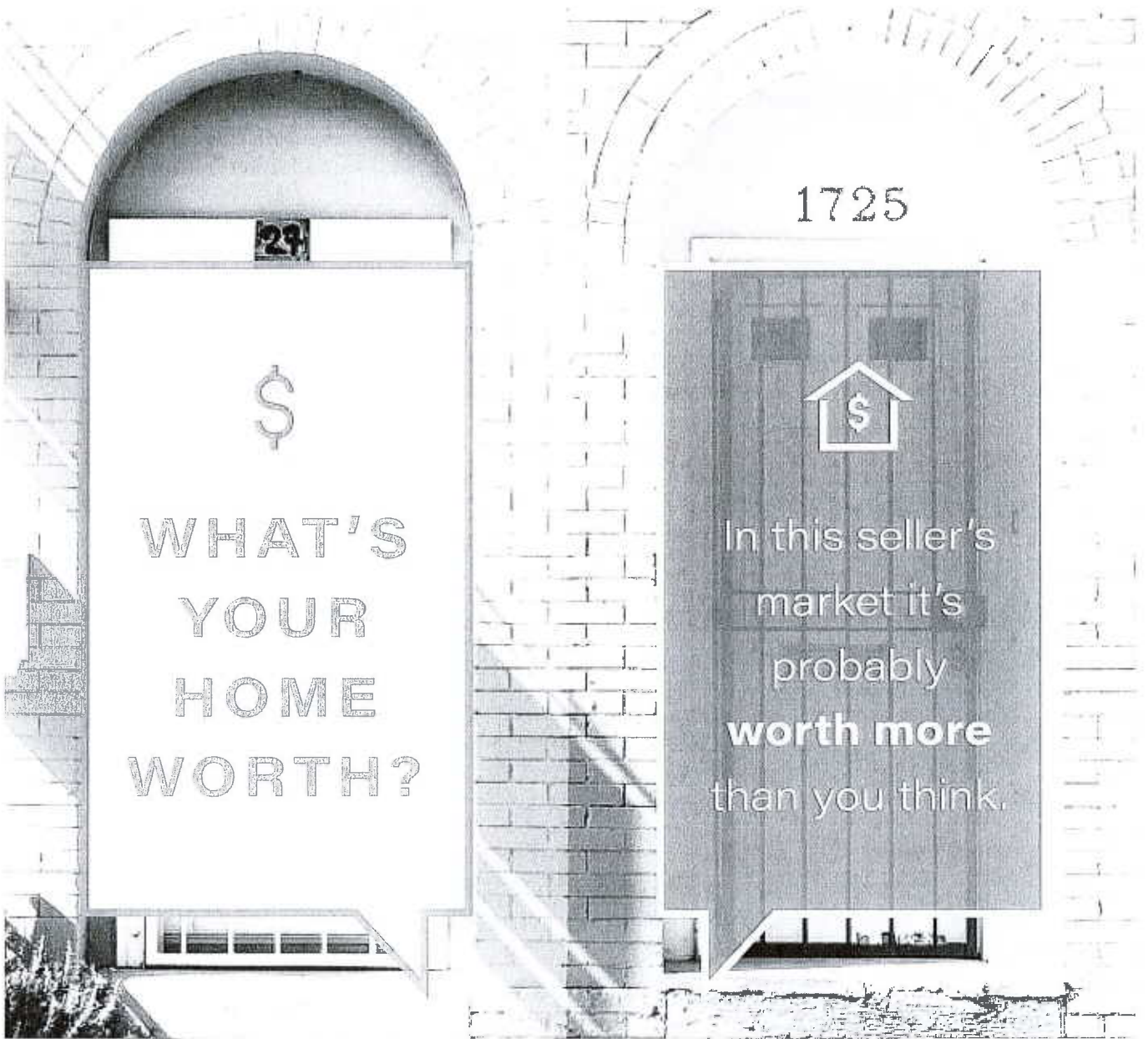
Borage, Lemon Balm (a spreader!), ***Sage, Rosemary, Oregano*** (can act like a ground cover) ***Anise Hyssop, Lavender, Chives, Fennel, Chamomile*** and ***Cilantro*** and ***Parsley***
