There is a process the Village must follow when pursuing violations. Violations may be reported by anyone to the Covenant Advisor. The Covenant Advisor will verify the validity of the complaint by making a property visit. Please remember you may not see an immediate resolution to a valid violation.

If you receive a letter from this office about a violation, we encourage you to immediately call the office. We work with our residents. By ignoring our letters, the Village must continue with the enforcement process.

It is upsetting when you receive a letter. We understand. The Covenant Advisor is here to help and guide you back to a compliant property. Please call or email us. Contact information is contained in the letter you receive via mail.

**Bulk Trash Items:** Residents receiving County-provided curbside trash collection are eligible for curbside bulk trash and metal collection. Residents in private areas that do not receive County collection are not eligible for bulk pickup. Remember: Bulk trash items collected by the County will be sent to a landfill. Residents may call 410-313-6444. Large trash items (individual items which do not fit in trash cans) such as mattresses, box springs, chairs, sofas, dressers and tables will be collected. Place these items at the curb on your regular trash day. Maximum of 4 large trash items will be collected per pick-up. Items must be able to be lifted by two collection crew members (larger items will be tagged and left for the resident's disposal). Bulk metal items include metal swing sets, file cabinets, appliances, lawn mowers, exercise equipment, etc. must be scheduled. Please remove doors from refrigerators, and drain oil and gas from lawn mowers. Please go to:

## The Village of Dorsey's Search

We are one of the 10 Villages of Columbia. The 9th village to be developed, Dorsey's Search's first residents began moving into the Dorsey Hall neighborhood in 1980. Fairway Hills is our other neighborhood which is home to the Fairway Hills Golf Club; owned and operated by Columbia Association.

Residents paying the Columbia Association (CA) annual charge are considered CA lien paying residents. As a CA resident, you will be charged a lower rate to join the gyms, pools, and other facilities owned by Columbia Association. Please contact CA membership services for information about pricing and packages. CA's main number is 410-715-3000.

The Village does not collect the annual charge. Money is collected by Columbia Association and then disbursed to the 10 villages. The disbursement provides for Village staff salaries, up keep of the building, and village events for our residents. Any income the Village makes through room rentals goes back to the community by subsidizing our Village events or for the maintenance of our Community Center located at Linden Hall and the Meeting Room located by the Dorsey Hall pool. If you are new to the Village, please feel free to visit and we can give you a free Welcome packet. Our address is 4765 Dorsey Hall Drive, Ellicott City. Our building is marked as Linden Hall.

We believe this is one of the best places to raise a family. Our families are active in their schools and active on Social Media. Dear Dorsey's Search Residents,

The 2023 Annual Report highlights the activities and services provided by the Dorsey's Search Community Association, Inc. (DSCA) during Fiscal Year 2023 that began May 1, 2022 and ended on April 30, 2023.

An association member of DSCA is defined as a property owner or a tenant (individual residing on property within Dorsey's Search under a written lease) residing in the Village of Dorsey's Search. DSCA is a non-profit civic organization whose purpose is to promote the health, safety, common good and social welfare of its Members.

The village office for DSCA is located at Linden Hall in the Dorsey's Search Village Center at the opposite end from the Giant. The normal hours of operation are Monday and Friday from 8 a.m. until 3 p.m.; Tuesday through Thursday from 8 a.m. until 7 p.m.; Saturday from 9-11 a.m. and the office is closed to the public on Sunday.

The village office provides a variety of services such as purchase of HOA documents, fax and laminating service, welcome packets, monthly newsletter, web site, pathway maps, information and referral.

DSCA sponsors several special events for the residents of our community. Some events are free while others are subsidized with funds generated from rental income. The type of programs and special events include: senior holiday lunch, community holiday dinner, family pool party, volunteer dinner, village elections, Breakfast with Santa, Storytime with Santa, E.C. Volunteer Fire Dept. with Santa, shredding events, cellphones for soldiers, collecting non-perishable food items for the food bank, Community Clean-up Day, Fall Fest.

The funding to manage and operate the buildings comes from two sources, one being the assessment share from the Columbia Association and the other source is from rental income. DSCA manages two facilities the Dorsey's Search Meeting Room next to the Dorsey Hall pool and Linden Hall in the village center.

The Resident Architectural Committee (RAC) is a very active board appointed committee of highly dedicated volunteers. The RAC members meet twice per month on the first and third Wednesday to review exterior alteration application requests from residents. There were a total of 308 applications with 37 regular track applications, 271 accelerated applications. Of



the 308 applications, 302 applications were approved and 6 denied. Forty-six compliance and 45 non-compliance letters were issued.
