It is a useful piece of paper and will help you and other surveyors with finding your property lines. Almost all properties have a recorded plat located at Howard County Land Records.

Most alterations in the Village of Dorsey's Search require you to submit a plat plan with your application. Dimension of the new structures and distances to existing structures and property lines are necessary for the committee to review your exterior change. If you cannot locate your plat plan, please give us a call at 410-730-4005 or email Anne McKissick at amckissick@dorseyssearch.org. We will direct you in the right direction.

We do not accept google map property line pictures. There are no coordinates or measurements. Feel free to contact us if you have any questions.

Curb Your Dog—phrase information is from Wikipedia

"This phrase was used in NYC for residents to have their dogs defecate on the edge of the street (gutter) and not on the sidewalk back in 1937."

Cardinal flower (*Lobelia cardinalis*) is a native plant of North, South, and Central America, normally found in moist areas such as streams, swamps, and low-wooded areas.

- Attracts hummingbirds
- Likes full sun, but does well with afternoon shade
- · Loves rich, moist to wet soil
- · Hardy with few pests & diseases; common pest are slugs and snails
- Deer resistant
- Toxic to human and pets

Swam milkweed is a member of the milkweed family.

- Beloved by bees and butterflies
- Critical host for monarch butterflies
- Deer and rabbit resistant once matured
- Does well in moist clay soil
- Toxic to human and pets

The blooms of swamp milkweed come in shades of soft mauve to pink to reddish-violet or occasionally white. Five nectar cups form a crown on five small petals, ideal for intricate pollination. By autumn, narrow pods reveal flat brown seeds attached to the white tufts characteristic of all milkweeds.

Like most milkweed species, swamp milkweed is clump-forming. Sturdy, upright clumps grow on stems four to five feet tall and two to three feet wide. Leaves grow in pairs, stiff, taper-pointed, and lance-shaped. Sometimes the edges of a leaf turn inward and upward. Milkweed is toxic to humans and pets.





Bulk Trash Items: Residents receiving County-provided curbside trash collection are eligible for curbside bulk trash and metal collection. Residents in private areas that do not receive County collection are not eligible for bulk pickup. Remember: Bulk trash items collected by the County will be sent to a landfill. Residents may call 410-313-6444. Large trash items (individual items which do not fit in trash cans) such as mattresses, box springs, chairs, sofas, dressers and tables will be collected. Place these items at the curb on your regular trash day. Maximum of 4 large trash items will be collected per pick-up. Items must be able to be lifted by two collection crew members (larger items will be tagged and left for the resident's disposal). Bulk metal items include metal swing sets, file cabinets, appliances, lawn mowers, exercise equipment, etc. must be scheduled. Please remove doors from refrigerators, and drain oil and gas from lawn mowers. Please go to:
